Better Alternatives

Biodegradable, recycled, organic – alternative materials make these eco products better for the planet.

Materials



Bamboo: Durable, highly renewable and 100% biodegradable.



Organic Cotton: Harvested sustainably and responsibly to minimize the impact on the planet.



Recycled Cotton: There are two types: Pre-consumer, which is salvaged from the manufacturing of cotton goods, and post-consumer, which comes from used tees, towels and upholstery.



rPET: Recycled Polyethylene Terephthalate. It's a fancy way to say "recycled plastic." Used in bottles and containers, PET is the most commonly recycled plastic in the world.



REPVEVE®: High-quality fibers and resin made from 100% recycled materials, including post-consumer bottles and pre-consumer industrial waste. The materials are certified, traceable and sourced from bottles at high risk of entering the ocean.



Wheat Straw: This rigid, durable stalk left over from wheat harvests is similar to a hard plastic.



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The Forest Stewardship Council®, or FSC® for short, is an international nonprofit that promotes responsible management of the world's forests. The FSC® is responsible for the wellbeing of forests and forest farmers around the world. The organization takes precautions to ensure that forests are grown ethically and sustainably.

The FSC® Chain-Of-Custody certification traces the path of FSC®-certified products from forests through the supply chain, verifying that FSC®-certified material is identified or kept separated from non-certified material. The process ensures that the FSC®-certified products you buy are from responsibly managed forests.
